SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

Born: 12 July 1936, Birmingham, Alabama

Files available to the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Department of the Army, disclosed the following information concerning Delmos John JONES:

a. JONES was a member of the Labor Youth League (LYL) (*1) in San Francisco, California. In 1955 and 1956, JONES was a member of the Franklin Delane Roosevelt Club of the LYL in Los Angeles, California, and during that period HE participated in its activities as follows:

- (1) Held office
- (2) Attended meetings and functions
- (3) Paid dues

b. In 1952 and 1953, JONES was a member of the Writer's Workshop of the East Bay Youth Cultural Center and attended meetings of that organization. (The East Bay Youth Cultural Center was created by the LYL in the fall of 1952 for the purpose of recruiting new members into the LYL.)

c. In 1954, JONES subscribed to the "Pacific Coast Youth Recorder" and participated in its activities, as follows:

- (1) Was a member of the staff
- (2) Submitted stories for publication
- (3) Attended meetings

(The "Pacific Coast Youth Recorder" was a Marxist newspaper published monthly in Los Angeles, California, and in 1954 the editorial and political policies of the publication were dominated by the LYL.)

d. JONES has purchased copies of the "People's World" (PW) (*2). In 1954, 1955, and 1957, JONES attended affairs sponsored by the "PW" in San Francisco, California.

e. In 1951 and 1952, JONES attended meetings of the Civil Rights Congress (*3) in Richmond, California.

f. In 1957, JONES attended meetings of the California Labor School (*4) in San Francisco, California.

g. In 1958, JONES attended a meeting of the Socialist Workers Party (*5) in San Francisco, California.

h. On Armed Forces Security Questionnaire (DD Form 98) dated 19 September 1958, JONES failed to list HIS membership and activities in the LYL.

i. On Statement of Personal History (DD Form 398) dated 19 September 1958, JONES failed to list HIS past or present membership in subversive organizations, denied past or present membership or association with subversive groups and/or persons, participation in the activities of such groups, and any incidents which might reflect upon HIS loyalty to the United States.

j. JONES maintains a close and continuing association with Paula KROTSEK, who, in 1955, was a member of and held office in the Communist Party (CP) in Santa Cruz and Monterey Counties, California. Investigation disclosed no indication that she has terminated her membership in the CP.

k. JONES maintains a close and continuing association with George Raymond KROTSEK, who, in 1955, was a member of the CP and investigation disclosed no indication that he has terminated his membership.

l. Of 22 persons, who had known JONES for periods of less than one to more than five years, 17 considered HIM loyal to the United States government. Three persons declined to comment concerning HIS loyalty due to their limited association with JONES and two did not comment regarding HIS loyalty. Nine persons recommended HIM for a position of trust, and three declined to comment concerning a recommendation due to their limited association with JONES. Ten persons did not comment concerning a recommendation.
